Please read these instructions in their entirety. Failure to comply with these instructions may delay the processing of your U.S. Nonimmigrant Visa application.

To complete this application for a U.S. Nonimmigrant Visa, each applicant listed below must appear with supporting Visa application documents for an in-person interview at the U.S. Consular Section.

Please gather the documents for each applicant listed below. Have each of the applicants bring a copy of their individual instructions with them to the Consular Section interview.

You must appear for an in-person interview at the Consular Section. Please gather the documents listed below and bring them with you to your interview and a copy of these instructions.

Applicants will be turned away the day of their interview if unable to present evidence of being a Canadian Citizen or Permanent Resident of Canada. Applicants must present a Canadian Passport or Permanent Resident card, a Record of Landing (IMM1000), or a Confirmation of Permanent Residence (IMM5292 or IMM5688).

Applicants applying for a visa at any consular section must present an Online Nonimmigrant Visa Application (DS-160) confirmation number that matches the application number used to schedule their appointment. Applicants who entered an incomplete, incorrect, or a different DS-160 confirmation number in the visa appointment system must update the DS-160 number in the scheduling system at least three business days before their interview appointment without having to cancel their existing appointment. Applicants who do not comply with this requirement will have to reschedule their appointment and may have to pay new visa fees.

In general, only Visa applicants with scheduled appointments are allowed to enter the Consular Section. Parents or legal guardians are allowed to accompany minor children. For special instructions concerning translators or caregivers, visit the Consular Section website.

General Required Documents - For All Visa Types

The following documents are required for all visa types:

1. Current Passport valid for travel to the United States. The passport must be valid for at least six months beyond the period of stay in the United States (unless exempt by [country-specific agreements](#).)
2. Passport containing the most recently issued U.S. visa (if applicable).
3. Nonimmigrant Visa Application, Form DS-160 confirmation page.
4. Confirmation and Instructions page printed from this website
5. One 5 x 5 cm (2 x 2 inches) color photo taken within the last 6 months. Further details regarding Department of State photo guidelines can be found at: <https://travel.state.gov/content/travel/en/us-visas/visa-information-resources/photos.html>
6. Copy of proof of your legal status in Canada

If you are attending an appointment in person, you must bring original documents. If you are eligible to send your documents via courier, you must send your current valid passport and the prior passport containing the most recently issued U.S. visa (if applicable), as well as the DS-160 confirmation page and copies of any other supporting documents. Please see the section below for a list of supporting documents required for each visa type.

(B) VISITOR: BUSINESS, TOURISM, MEDICAL TREATMENT

- Be ready to present the following documents, if traveling for medical treatment:
 - Medical diagnosis from a local physician, explaining the nature of the ailment and the reason treatment is needed in the United States.
 - Letter from a physician or medical facility in the United States stating the willingness to treat the diagnosed ailment, and detailing the projected length and cost of treatment (including doctors' fees, hospitalization fees, and all medical-related expenses).
 - Proof that the patient's transportation, medical, and living expenses in the United States will be paid. This may be in the form of bank or other statements of income/savings or certified copies of income tax returns (either the patient's or the person or organization paying for the treatment).
- You may apply for a B-1 visitor visa to work temporarily in the U.S. as a personal or domestic employee in limited situations. You and your employer will be required to prove the employment relationship meets the wages and working conditions of the U.S. For further details on how to apply, visit your local U.S. Embassy's website and <https://travel.state.gov/content/travel/en/us-visas/tourism-visit/visitor.html>

When attending an in-person consular interview, additional documents may be requested to establish if you are qualified for the visa. If you qualify for NOT attending an in-person consular interview, submit only the required documents specifically listed on the instruction page.

For example, additional requested documents for an in-person interview may include evidence of:

- The purpose of your trip
- Your intent to depart the United States after your trip; and/or
- Your ability to pay all the costs of your trip.
- Evidence of your employment and/or family ties may be sufficient to show the purpose of your trip and your intent to return to your home country.
- If you cannot cover all the costs for your trip, you may show evidence that another person will cover some or all of the costs for your trip.

Visa Issuance Fee (Reciprocity Fee)

Depending on the applicant's country of citizenship and the visa type, the applicant may also be required to pay an additional fee for visa issuance, known as a reciprocity fee. Starting June 1, 2025, the Quebec City consular section will only accept credit card payments for reciprocity and issuance fees, they will no longer accept cash. All other consular sections will continue to accept credit card and cash payments.
